CCRTA Will Resume Collecting Fares Tomorrow

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas – The Corpus Christi Regional Transportation Authority (CCRTA) will return to collecting fares Saturday, December 17 for all fixed route and B-Line services.

Due to the recent water contamination the CCRTA eliminated fares for all services beginning Thursday, December 15 at 11 a.m. through end of service on Friday to allow Coastal Bend residents to travel for free to obtain bottled water.

Since the City of Corpus Christi has lifted the ban on several areas throughout the Coastal Bend and most residents have been able to get bottled water the CCRTA decided to resume fares as usual.
