## **Mask Use Now Optional Throughout CCRTA Transit System**

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas – Corpus Christi Regional Transportation Authority (CCRTA) will no longer require mask use throughout its public transportation system, which includes buses, bus stops, and facilities. CCRTA encourages mask use, as the CDC continues to recommend that individuals wear masks in indoor public transportation settings at this time.

**Masks will continue to be available at no cost when boarding CCRTA transportation at this time.**

“Due to today’s court ruling, effective immediately, TSA will no longer enforce its Security Directives and Emergency Amendment requiring mask use on public transportation and transportation hubs. TSA will also rescind the new Security Directives that were scheduled to take effect tomorrow. CDC continues to recommend that people wear masks in indoor public transportation settings at this time.”
